

Cutting Projected Patterns

1. Lay fabric out on your cutting mat with the grain parallel to the projection.
2. Smooth out fabric using the weights included with the Ditto system. Keep fabric flat on the mat while cutting. Move fabric weights as needed.
3. Transfer any markings using a temporary fabric marker.
4. Use the Rotary Cutter included with the Ditto system. If you prefer, regular fabric scissors can be used.
5. Cut on the outside edge of the pattern line. A 5/8" seam allowance is already accounted for in the pattern projection.
6. For very large spliced pieces, we recommend tracing the pattern piece with a fabric marking tool, then cutting.

Tips & Tricks

- To align folded fabric, project first and then move the folded fabric edge to the projected fold line.
- If using very thick fabric like faux fur or sherpa, project on the back of the fabric and cut. Or you may want to trace first, then cut if you're not using rotary scissors.
- Use a chair or a stool to support extra fabric draping over the side of the table to prevent fabric slippage.
- To easily identify pattern pieces after cutting, use a fabric marking tool or a sticky note to label the pattern number on the piece.
